

Departmental Requirements

- Is the Principal supportive?
- Has the Principal discussed this with their Director?
- Has this been discussed with the Community?
- Has this been discussed with Staff?
- Is the Health and Vaccinations of the dog up to date?
- Has the dog undergone some recognised obedience training?
- Will the dog have access to food, water and a safe place as necessary?
- Who will be the handler of the dog?
- Is there are Risk Management Plan in place?



Dogs at School – Research



Dogs at School – Research indicates

- Groups of students become more socially homogenous with less behavioural extremes
- Less aggressiveness and hyperactivity
- Withdrawn students became more socially integrated
- On average students paid more attention to the teacher
- Effects were more pronounced in boys than girls



Potential benefits for the student and school

- Research supports the support of health, well being and normal development in children
- Improving quality of life as a tool for socialising, relaxation and communication
- Help reduce anxiety and stress
- Increases in opportunity to display independence and confidence by looking after a pet
- Gaining awareness of pro-social behaviour in regard to treating animals appropriately
- Opportunities for sensory stimulation and exercise and enables children to receive and give attention and affection

The dog provides a nonjudgemental acceptance of the student, especially when reading aloud or completing challenging tasks.


I am her owner. It is important that she listens to what I say to ensure that she does not get into any mischief.

- If you see me please make sure you ask my owner before you pat me.




- I am Graeme Lindsay

Franklin


- My name is Franklin and I am friendly and love to play.

Franklin is also learning how to ask for things that he wants using augmentative and alternative communication via voice recorded buttons.



Use of Izzy, Dougal and Franklin

- Used to build rapport with students
- Used to de-escalate students during emotionally tense moments
- To provide comfort and confidence when students are completing set tasks
- To provide a calming environment to all students.
- Izzy, Dougal and Franklin are the sole responsibility of their owners. They reside in CR0027 (Dougal) or in the Teaching and Learning Staffroom (Izzy) and in the Support Unit (Franklin) unless in class with their owners.
- A risk management plan has been established.

Important Things to Remember

- Make sure you ask our owners before you pat us
- If it is ok. Stand side on, and pat the dog on their back away from their mouth.



What do I do if I have a phobia of dogs?

Moving around the school (playground / hallways):

- 1. Stand still with your arms beside you.
- 2. Let the teacher know that you are uncomfortable
- 3. Stay Calm and the owner will quickly move the dog away from you.

In the classroom

- 1. Stay in your chair
- 2. Let the teacher know that you are uncomfortable
- 3. Stay calm and the owner will quickly remove the dog from the classroom.

It is important that you let your teacher know how you are feeling so we can move the dog away immediately. Please do not feed us without asking. Remember to put your food in the bin. We don't want to eat anything that can make us sick. If you see me eating something I shouldn't,

PLEASE tell my owner





Don't even think about blaming us!



We love to run and play. In the playground please do not chase us. We could get scared.



Make sure you wash your hands after you pat us, especially before you eat.



What do I do if I have an allergy to animal hair?

- 1. Please tell your teacher immediately that you are allergic to dogs.
- 1. If you do come into contact with animal hair please tell your teacher and follow your ASIA action plan.

It is important that you tell your teacher that you are allergic to animal hair. The owner will remove the dog from the space immediately.
